



## Identity Across Borders

In preparation for its 2006 Symposium, IAAC is holding a series of workshops to explore different aspects of Identity Assurance. The final workshop in the series will discuss the need for Identity Assurance in the international context as transactions routinely occur across different regulatory environments. This builds on previous workshops that looked at how individuals might administer their own data and at the role of Identity Assurance in delivering e-Government services. Through participation at the workshops, IAAC Members will make a contribution to the IAAC Identity Assurance Roadmap, to be launched at the Seventh Annual Symposium on 5 July.

While there is a lot of debate in the UK about identity, identity plays an increasingly important role in relation to cross-border transactions. Across borders, economic and security aspects in particular play key roles in determining how personal data and identity are dealt with.

This workshop will explore the issues to gain insight into the international requirements of a proper Identity Assurance policy and its implementation, including an understanding of what it takes for a service provider to deliver services to people in different regulatory environments. Speakers will explain what they encountered in their involvement in setting up identity management schemes in their countries, all within the European context.

The findings of the workshops will be integral part of IAAC current activities for the development of a Roadmap for Identity Assurance.
